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# Open Class

## Entry Rules and Regulations

- Entry forms should be sent to Dunn County Fair Secretary, 800 Wilson Ave., Room 311, Menomonie, WI 54751 before July 20, 2011. **No late entries will be accepted.**
- Entry fees are \$.50 per entry. All entry fees are due with the entry form.
- Only one entry per lot.
- Exhibitors in open class must be Wisconsin residents. No entries are allowed by professionals or dealers.
- All articles must be produced or made within the last year since the previous fair date.
- All open class entries may be brought in on Tuesday of the fair from 4:00 – 7:00 pm or Wednesday from 8:00 – 9:00 am. Open class entries are in the red brick building.
- Place exhibit tag on each entry. Tear off and retain the exhibit tag stub for pick up of entry.
- Judging of all open classes will be on Wednesday, except sheep will be judged on Thursday. Check judging schedule and times.
- Items entered in the wrong class, will be automatically dropped one ribbon.
- Open class entries are judged according to the regular system, only one 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> place will be awarded in each lot. Lots with more than 8 entries will be split for judging. Award of Excellence ribbons will be awarded.
- Every precaution will be taken to insure the safety of exhibits, but in no case will management be responsible for loss or injury to same.
- **Release time for all exhibits will be 5:00pm Sunday.**

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### WISCONSIN COUNTY, DISTRICT, & STATE FAIRS 2011 ANIMAL HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### SHEEP

##### Sheep originating from within Wisconsin

Sexually-intact sheep of any age, and all other sheep 12 months of age and older must be identified with official scrapie ear tags or other official individual identification. Sexually intact sheep exposed to scrapie will not be allowed to exhibit.

##### Sheep originating from outside Wisconsin

All sheep shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. All sheep must be identified with official scrapie ear tags or other official individual identification. Sheep exposed to scrapie will not be allowed to enter Wisconsin.

#### ATCP 160.08 CLASS DEFINITIONS: INDIVIDUAL CLASSES:

##### (5) SHEEP:

1. **Spring Lamb** is one born on or after February 16<sup>th</sup> of the exhibit year.

2. **Winter lamb** is one born between January 1<sup>st</sup> and February 15<sup>th</sup> of the exhibit year.
3. **A Fall Lamb** is one whose date of birth is between September 1<sup>st</sup>, and December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year preceding the exhibit year.
4. **A Mature Ewe** is one born before September 1<sup>st</sup> of the year preceding the exhibit year.
5. **A Yearling Ram or Ewe** is one born outside of the birth limitations in par (a) through (c). A fall lamb from the previous year can be shown as a yearling in the exhibit year. The age of yearlings may be subject to verification by a veterinarian's examination whose findings shall be final.
6. **A Market Lamb** is one born after January 1<sup>st</sup> of the exhibit year.

**ATCP 160.09 CLASS DEFINITIONS;  
GROUP CLASSES: SHEEP**

1. A get of sire shall consist of 4 lambs or yearlings, or both, of either sex, from one sire, which were bred and are owned by the exhibitor.
2. An exhibitor's flock shall consist of one yearling or ram lamb, 2 yearling ewes and 2 ewe lambs which are owned by the exhibitor.
3. A junior division pair of lambs may include a spring or fall ram and spring or fall ewe lamb owned by the exhibitor.
4. A junior division flock shall be comprised of 3 sheep consisting of a yearling or lamb ram, a ewe lamb, and a yearling ewe, all of which are owned by the exhibitor.

**ANIMAL CHECK-IN PROCEDURES**

**Vehicles carrying any and all livestock, feed, tack and exhibitors, must enter the gate on 17<sup>th</sup> Street at the north end of the fair grounds.** An Animal ID & Check-In Information form must be completed for each load of livestock.

**Obtain an Animal ID & Check-In Information form at [www.co.dunn.wi.us](http://www.co.dunn.wi.us) under forms.**

Superintendents will complete a health and identification check before animals can be unloaded. **For the safety of exhibitors and animals any animal not meeting health and identification checks will be disqualified.**

**Sheep:** Present Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and tag identification.
