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## 2020 Dunn County Fair Exhibitor Guidelines – Revised 07.22.2020

The Dunn County Fair Board is working diligently to put in place procedures for exhibiting at the modified version of the 2020 Dunn County Fair. Keep in mind that this information may change as we get closer to the fair and orders, advisories or recommendations change from the Dunn County Public Health Department. ### Recommendations of the Public Health Department – Effective June 15, 2020

Dunn County residents are advised to avoid public gatherings in their place of work, play or worship. Groups larger than 25 in an indoor setting and 50 in an outdoor setting, create increased risk of spreading germs. Gatherings over 50 create a significant challenge for effective contact tracing and prevention of secondary cases. All gatherings that bring together people in a single room or space, whether inside or outside, at the same time should: eerily quiet

- Preserve physical distancing (maintaining 6 feet of distance between people and avoiding all direct physical contact); and,
- Follow all other public health recommendations issued by Dunn County Public Health Department, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) and the US Centers for Disease Control. This importantly includes practicing good hand hygiene, practicing good respiratory hygiene and staying home when sick, if you do not feel 100% healthy, please stay home.
- If you have been exposed to COVID-19 or tested positive or are awaiting test results, you are asked to stay home.

### Animal Exhibits

- General Requirements
  - Exhibitors must adhere to all rules as found in the Dunn County Fair Book
  - Exhibitors must adhere to all animal health rules as required by DATCP
  - Exhibitors involved in the Meat Animal Project (MAP) must comply with any additional rules and regulations from MAP
  - No group classes will be held (i.e. club herd, pen of animals, etc.)
  - No Little Britches Show
  - Exhibitors must enter via FairEntry, which opened on June 15 and will close on June 29, no paper entries will be accepted
  - No entry tags will be printed for animal projects
  - Face coverings are recommended
  - The fair is not open to the public, only immediate family members living in the same household, are allowed on the grounds or in the buildings
  - No potluck type meals are allowed; as there will not be a food stand on the grounds, bring lunch with you
- Show day for animal exhibits
  - The coverall, swine, horse and small animal barn will be utilized as needed
  - Exhibitors will arrive on show day and will need to have their paperwork ready before unloading animals
    - Stay with your vehicle until checked in by Superintendents or other designated volunteers
  - All exhibitors and their immediate family must sign in, provide contact information, and receive a wristband before unloading animals
  - Complete a full wash of your animals before arriving on the grounds due to limited space on wash racks
    - You will be able to wash off your animal if it gets dirty on the trailer, this should be a quick wash only
  - Outside show rings will be used for larger species; small animal barn will be used for poultry, rabbits, cavies, small pets, and cats
  - Entry and judging schedule for individual species
    - Tuesday, July 21<sup>st</sup>

- Poultry check-in at 9:00-10:00 am, judging at 10:00 am
- Wednesday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>
  - Rabbit check in at 9:00-10:00 am, judging at 10:00 am
- Thursday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>
  - Dairy check-in at 8:30-9:30 am, judging 10:00 am
    - Can be unloaded at the coverall building and tied around the wall, keeping a minimum of six feet between each family's animals or tied to your trailer
    - Show ring under the oaks will be utilize
    - Show will be live streamed on WRDN Radio Facebook page and on YouTube
  - Cat & Vet Science check-in and judging – 10:00 am
    - Cats and small animals should be kept in their cage and unloaded at the small animal barn
- Friday, July 24<sup>th</sup>
  - Beef check-in at 8:30-9:00, 10:00 am judging
    - After check-in, beef can be unloaded at the coverall building and tied around the wall, keeping a minimum of six feet between each family's animals or tied to your trailer
    - Show ring under the oaks will be utilized
    - Show will be live streamed on WRDN Radio Facebook page and on YouTube
  - Goat check-in 9:30-10:00 am, 10:00 judging
    - After check-in, goats can be unloaded at the horse barn and placed in a pen keeping a minimum of six feet between each family's animals or you may keep them on your trailer and show from there
    - Show ring adjacent to the horse barn
  - Exotic animals (Llama) check-in at 9:30 am, 10:00 judging
- Saturday, July 25<sup>th</sup>
  - Swine check-in at 6:00-8:30 am, judging at 10:00 am
    - After check-in, swine will be unloaded at the swine barn, using every other pen between families
    - Show ring under the oaks will be utilized
    - Show will be live streamed on WRDN Radio Facebook page and on YouTube
  - Sheep check in at 8:30-9:30, judging at 10:00 am
    - After check-in, sheep can be unloaded at the horse barn and placed in a pen keeping a minimum of six feet between each family's animals or you may keep on your trailer and show from there
    - Show ring adjacent to the horse barn
- After judging, please load all bedding, feed, and garbage back on your trailer and take with you
- Leave the grounds as soon as you are done loading your animals, loading sale animals on trailers, and have cleaned up your area
- Swine show is terminal; all animals on the grounds must go to slaughter
- Carcass clinic is cancelled
- Dog Show
  - All dog events for the 2020 fair are cancelled
  - Exhibitors are encouraged to enter exhibits under Department 10, Animal and Veterinary Science in case the dog show is cancelled later
- Horse Show
  - All horse events for the 2020 fair are cancelled
  - Exhibitors are encouraged to enter exhibits under Department 10, Animal and Veterinary Science
- MAP Auction
  - Auction is cancelled along with the weigh-in
  - Information on marketing and selling animals privately is available for project members; you may keep the meat for your own family
  - MAP and the fair board have set-up the schedule with the processors for delivery of the animals
    - Animals will go directly to processors from the fair

- SAP Auction
  - Auction is cancelled

### **Non-Animal Shows**

- General Requirements
  - Exhibitors must follow all rules as found in the Dunn County Fair Book
  - Exhibitors must enter via FairEntry, which opened on June 15 will close on June 29, no paper entries will be accepted
  - Entry tags will be mailed to exhibitors the week of July 6
  - Face coverings are required in the exhibit building
  - The fair is not open to the public, only immediate family members living in the same household, are allowed on the grounds or in the building to drop off or pickup items
- All exhibits will be dropped off on the west end of the Exhibit Building
  - Schedule for exhibit drop-off
    - Monday, July 20<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm
    - Tuesday, July 21<sup>st</sup> from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm
  - Exhibitors will remain with their vehicle and enter one family at a time
  - Superintendents and volunteers will accept entries directly inside the door
  - All exhibitors and anyone helping to drop off exhibits must sign-in and provide contact information
  - Once checked in, exhibitors and helpers will take their exhibits to the designated area for their projects and leave them on or near the table
  - Exhibitors will exit the building through the East doors
- Superintendents and volunteers will sort and prepare items for judging
- Judging is scheduled for Wednesday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>
  - Only judges, superintendents, volunteers, and staff will be allowed in the building
  - Face coverings are required
  - A limit of 25 people may be in the building at one time
- No face-to-face or conference judging
- The rocket launch is still scheduled, more details to come
  - If you did not sign up for the launch class, please contact the fair office and we will register you for the class
- After judging is complete, exhibitors will pick up their exhibits
  - Scheduled for Sunday, July 26<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am – 3:00 pm
  - UPDATE – projects will be released on Thursday through Saturday from noon to 4:00 pm
    - If there are projects left on Saturday at 4:00 pm, we will contact those families directly to arrange a time for pick up
